## 7 steps to making your own comic

(This is just one way of doing it. Feel free to experiment!)

- 1 Plot ...... What happens in your story? Where does it take place? How does it start and how does it end? Who is the main character?
- **2 Character**What does your main character look like? You'll draw them over and over again, so it helps to work out what they look like from the start.
- **3 Script** .... Use words to plan the pictures that will make up your comic. Who is in each picture, what are they saying and doing?
- **4 Layout** .... Think about the box that each picture will be in. What size and shape will they be?
- **5 Pencilling**Drawing the pictures in pencil, Make sure it's clear what is going on. You'll need to leave room for the words too.
- Speech balloons and thought bubbles show what people are saying and thinking. Captions are sentences that tell the reader what's going on. Sound effects make lots of noise!
- 7 Inking .... Finishing the drawings in black ink makes your comic look neat and clear. Don't forget to rub out your pencil lines!
